Local Government Engagement Overview

Update as of 7/10/2017

In February 2016, Expect More Arizona and the Center for the Future of Arizona - with the endorsement of 40 organizations, launched the Arizona Education Progress Meter. The Education Progress Meter represents key milestones on the path to improving educational opportunities and outcomes for all Arizonans. Progress made in each area will ultimately create a more prosperous economy, ensure students have the knowledge and credentials necessary for good jobs and improve the civic health of communities.

We know that it will take local communities leading the way to make significant progress on these indicators and to help the state reach its 60% attainment goal by 2030. Therefore, it is critical to support local municipalities in adopting the Progress Meter and improving each of the indicators locally. In fact, many communities are already working to develop their own baselines and goals aligned to the Progress Meter. Through statewide outreach, Expect More Arizona and Center for the Future of Arizona are supporting existing community efforts as well as engaging additional local governments in adopting the state's attainment goal and Arizona Education Progress Meters as their tool for measuring local impact on education.
