



- Collaborate on bringing FAFSA resources to Arizona






State FAFSA Completion Goal



Goal Update

As of February 26th, 33% of Arizona high school seniors have completed the FAFSA. Arizona experienced a downward trend in FAFSA completions during the month of February with less than 2,100 high school seniors completing the application that month. This resulted in a



2% increase to the state's average FAFSA completion rate which is the lowest FAFSA increase that we have seen all year. According to the <u>Arizona FAF\$A Challenge Dashboard</u>, the state is currently down 7% in FAFSA completions compared to this time last year. It is important to note that Arizona is not alone in this downward trend since the vast majority of other states are down in FAFSA completions as well.

With high school graduation right around the corner, continued FAFSA efforts will be key to ensure that more Arizona students have options to pay for their postsecondary education. Here are some socially distant FAFSA efforts that high schools can implement to assist their seniors this spring.

- Host a FAFSA Drive-In *
- Host a virtual FAFSA workshop
- Provide virtual one-on-one FAFSA appointments
- Utilize your <u>FAFSA Finish Line Data</u>
- Collaborate with your college reps to assist with FAFSA's, college applications, verification, and next steps
