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

- 2. Reach the statewide attainment goal by 2030, starting with early learning and working through an aligned P20 continuum
- 3. Ensure all students have a fair shot at success
- 4. Advocate for state-level funding that is allocated more intentionally to those most in need




Percent of Arizona residents age 25-64 who have completed a 2- or 4-year degree or received an industry certificate.

Policy Priorities

Advancing the Achieve60AZ Attainment Goal, P-20

- P-20 Education Funding
- Teacher & workforce shortages (K-12 and early ed)
- Increase access and opportunity to complete a postsecondary degree or credential
- Increase access to early learning & literacy development



Policy Projects

Priority Projects:

- Creating a <u>shared agenda</u> to drive the Education Progress Meter forward
- Elevating education as a priority with gubernatorial candidates
- Advancing priority policy issues & creating a <u>network of</u> advocates
- Expanding action teams across the state



Issues to Watch in 2022

State

- Changes to the Aggregate Expenditure Limit (district LEAs only)
- Expansion of Arizona Promise Program (ABOR)
- Dual enrollment
- P-20 funding ABOR new economy initiative, CC funding
- Online preschool

Federal

 PreK and Pell Grant expansion (happening now with federal budget reconciliation)





Aggregate Expenditure Limit

- Impact of Prop 208 ruling makes Prop 301 funding subject to the limit for the first time
- Schools are projected to hit their spending limit in March 2022
- **\$1.2B** at risk
- Short-and-long-term fixes needed
 - Short-Term: Ability to exceed the limit for one year (requires 2/3 vote)
 - Long-Term: Is a spending limit needed? If so, what's the appropriate level?





Mayoral Engagement

- Support policies that ensure all students have a fair shot at success & move the needle on the Education Progress Meter goals
 - Supporting the Aggregate Expenditure Limit solutions
- Frame your community investments using the Arizona Education Progress Meter
- Invite us to present to others
- Models that work: Achieve Pinal; Mesa Education and Workforce Committee; Yuma Education and Advocacy Council
