Our Challenge: Increasing Education Attainment by 14% by 2030

Achieve60AZ

- 46% attainment today → 60% by 2030
- Arizona's attainment goal
- 1 million more people with credentials or degrees needed







In Arizona...

Nearly 7 out of 10 jobs require a degree or credential

However, just 46% of Arizonans have a degree or industry recognized credential today





Advancing Education Attainment

A more educated workforce, with training and credentials beyond high school leads to:

- Higher wages
- Increased tax revenue
- Less unemployment
- Healthy, vibrant communities

Arizona Education Progress Meter

Nonpartisan tool that helps us see where we stand and where we want to go

- Partnership with the Center for the Future of Arizona
- Includes 8 key education indicators and goals
- Includes state, county, city, district, school and subgroup date
- Community owned, developed with input from 200+ organizations statewide
- Data chosen as predictors of student success

An agreed upon framework to rally the community around common goals and encourage action



Developed by Arizona Experts













- Leaders selected to lead each indicator
- 200+ organizations involved in goal setting
- Extensive Vetting
- All goals lead to Achieve60AZ goal, focused on closing achievement gaps
- Launched in 2017








Arizona Education Progress Meter

How Can You Use the Education Progress Meter?




Communities Across the State are Using the Education Progress Meter

OUALITY EARLY LEARNING

Percent of Arizona 3- and 4-year old children that are in quality early learning settings.



THIRD GRADE READING

Percent of Arizona 3rd grade students who scored Proficient or Highly Proficient on the AzM2 3rd grade English language arts assessment.



EIGHTH GRADE MATH

Percent of Arizona 8th grade students who are prepared to be successful in high school math.



HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION

Percent of Arizona high school students graduating in 4 years.



OPPORTUNITY YOUTH

Percent of 16-24 year olds in Arizona that are NOT going to school or working.



POST-HIGH SCHOOL ENROLLMENT

Percent of high school graduates enrolled in postsecondary education the semester after graduating high



ATTAINMENT

Percent of Arizona residents 25-64 years of age who have completed a 2or 4-year degree or who have an active professional certificate or license.

 - Why are some students doing well and others not? What can be done to help all students succeed?
 - How can we close the achievement and opportunity gaps?
- Endorse the Education Progress Meter and Achieve60AZ goal
- Review your programs and funding
 - How are they helping to move the needle on the goals?
- Feature the Education Progress Meter on your website
 - What policies, programs and funding are needed to move the goals forward?

The actions we take now will shape the trajectory for AZ for generations


- We have great teachers and students with limitless potential
